Our curriculum has in-depth training of Anatomy and Physiology, injuries, common surgeries, movement therapies to help students understand the needs of the medical community. Although we are medical based, we teach the student to look at the whole person. The whole person is not just the physical part, it includes the emotional and mental aspects to each individual. Teaching students what they need to know to be successful. These aspects are taught in-depth to help understand that every part is connected together and must be acknowledged as the whole individual. The students at Southern Utah Academy of Healing Arts (SUAHA) will be molded in this fashion by working with practicing massage therapists, trained by our Chiropractor on campus, and have other experienced therapists from the medical field. Our school will be one of the first to raise the quality and knowledge of students entering the world of massage. Program Courses

Our massage school will get you ready for the career of Massage Therapy. When you finish with our program you will be qualified to take the National Certification Exam (NCE) provided by the National Certification Board of Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork (NCBTMB) or the Massage and Bodywork Licensing Exam (MBLEX). The total number of hours required for completion is 850 hours. That includes classroom learning hours, classroom massage practice hours and clinic massage hours. We include job placement assistance where we will help you find a local job through our connections in the community with doctors and local spas. There is no guarantee of placement. Included in the program are the following classes:

Advanced Massage Techniques and Assessments- This is a lecture, demonstration, and hands on course on medically oriented techniques. These techniques will include origin & insertion techniques, trigger point therapy, myofascial technique, movement therapy, and assessment of clients using medical massage therapies. This course is mostly medically oriented but also looks at the body as a whole by combining an understanding of energetic technique to fully assess the client. This class is 76 hours and will be split up into 19 classes.

Anatomy, Physiology and Kinesiology - This is equal to a college level course on how the human body is put together, how it works, and how its movement is affected. This class is 125 hours and will be split up into 31 classes.

Aromatherapy – In this class you will learn about the many uses for essential oils, stones and crystals. Learn how to use these tools to best help your clients. This class is 12 hours and will be split up into 3 classes. **Basic Nutrition** – Learn the basics of nutrition. What we take into or don't take into our bodies effects every body system. In this class you will also learn the basics of digestion and what is good and bad for the body. This class is 24 hours and will be split up into 6 classes.

Business - This is a course to teach students business skills to be able to run their own business or be an asset to a place of employment. This class is 28 hours and will be split up into 7 classes.

Cranial Sacral Therapies - Craniosacral work is based on a thorough knowledge of cranial and sacral anatomy and requires sensitivity of touch to enable the practitioner to discern, and then to utilize the cranial wave formation. This class is 36 hours and will be split up into 9 classes.

Energy Essentials – Everything is energy and energy frequencies, these studies will help the body worker to increase their intuition through techniques practiced by many cultures throughout the world. Chakra Balancing, Muscle Testing, Proper Shielding are just a few of the theories that will be explored. The class is 28 hours of in class work split into 7 days.

Ethics for Body Work Professionals – Understanding the difference between Ethical Behavior & Personal Morals is paramount to blending a successful career & satisfying personal relationships. This class will provide an understanding of boundaries, communications & attitudes. This class is 4 hours of in class work & 24 hours of individual workbook study, total 28 hours.

Flow - Continuation of Swedish massage at a deeper level. In this class students will learn to flow from one technique to the next. Giving a 30 and 90 minute protocol in addition to the previously learned 60 minute. This class is 52 hours and will be split up into 13 classes.

Lymph Drainage Massage - The lymphatic system plays an important role in maintaining immunity and circulating hormones. It is a gentle and relaxing massage that is a very different experience to normal therapeutic or deeper tissue massage. This class is 20 hours and will be split up into 5 classes.

Modalities – As a future LMT the more diverse modalities you are acquainted with, the more diverse your clientele can become. This class is 12 hours and will be split up into 3 classes.

Introduction to Medical Terms – This course is designed to give the student an understanding of applied terms used in the medical field. The ability to use suffixes, prefixes and roots will allow the student to feel competent in communicating with other medical professionals and create well written SOAP notes. Proper medical terminology gives the student the ability to understand basic pathology. This class is 8 hours in class, split into 2 classes and 4 hours at home work, a total of 12 hours.

Basic Pathology - The understanding of how different diseases affect the body and what to look for when presented with contagious diseases. This understanding can help with early intervention and treatment. Body workers who are trained in these studies can be a client's first line of defense. This class is 8 hours of in class work and 32 hours of at home work, a total of 48 hours.

Prenatal Massage- A working knowledge of the needs associated with pregnancy, delivery and postpartum care is vital to all body workers, especially the massage therapist. Students will gain a working understanding of the movement, compensations and changes in the woman's body, as well as the anatomy and physiology. This class is 28 hours of in class work split into 7 days.

Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) Foundations- Students will learn the basic foundations of Traditional Chinese Theory and Anatomy and how it can be practically applied by practitioners of massage therapeutics. A basic introduction to Eastern massage techniques and self-care techniques will prepare the student for further study into specific Eastern massage practices. This class is 36 hours and will be split into 9 classes.

Reflexology – Many different area of the body can reflect the overall health and workings of the body and students will learn a focused pressure techniques that focus on the feet, hands and ears, based on the premise that these are zones and reflexes on different parts of the body which correspond to and are relative to all parts. glands and organs. This class is 28 hours of in class work split into 7 days.

Sport Massage - The first portion of Sports Massage is designed to introduce students to basic sports massage techniques including: compression, tapotement, and vibration. Students will use these skills to perform pre and post-event massage on athletes or clients. Students also learn to recognize, help prevent, and assist thermal injuries, strains, sprains, and cramps. The second portion of Sports Massage is a course designed to prepare students to treat injuries and areas of chronic over-use resulting in pain and discomfort. The body is divided up into sections such as head and neck, shoulders, low back and sciatic pain. Each area will have an anatomy review and demonstration focusing on the muscles that are most often the cause of pain. Students are then encouraged to use their own knowledge and creativity along with the demonstration to design their own techniques. This class is 40 hours and will be split into 10 classes.

Student Clinic Hours – This will be 150 hours of massaging the public. The student will be practicing the massage techniques that they learned in class.

Swedish Massage - In this course the student will learn the history, theory and techniques of Swedish massage. The five strokes of the Swedish system and the application of these strokes in full body massage will be taught. Other topics will include techniques for draping and body positioning of clients. An overview of the indications and contraindications for Swedish massage, basic hygiene, equipment, lubricants and supplies will be presented. Instructions in body mechanics and self-care techniques will be covered. This class is 52 hours and will be 13 classes.

Test Preparation- It is reasonable that any teacher is going to help the student be prepared for the eventual testing period that is required to obtain a license for body work. The learning experience for the student would be to have a good knowledge base of the types of questions and environment that will be encountered at a testing center. This class will prepare you for the Mblex test. This class is 8 hours in class work, split into 2 classes and 8 hours at home work, with a total of 16 hours.

Thai Yoga Massage – An ancient healing system combining acupressure, Indian Ayurvedic principles, and assisted yoga postures. This class will help the student be able to increases flexibility, blood flow, and overall wellness for the client. This class is 24 hours and will be split into 6 classes.

Universal Precaution – Protecting the client & the professionals is paramount. A knowledge of basic lifesaving skills & the ability to quickly recognize & respond to emergencies are important for everyone, especially body workers. Students will also learn the responsibilities of a body worker of sanitation for the clients and themselves. This class is split up into Swedish, Flow, Ethics, Pathology. CPR certification is required to work on the public and the student will be informed as to where to receive the education for certification.



Entrance Requirement

Southern Utah Academy of Healing Arts (SUAHA) does not discriminate based on race, sex, religion, ethnic origin, or disability. We require a High School Diploma or GED, 18 years old and a desire to help people. Fill out our application at the end of this catalog.

Enrollment Procedures

Prospective students may enroll anytime. Late enrollments will be accepted only 5 days before classes start, depending on length of course. After filling out the application we will set up a time for you to come in for a tour and fill out an enrollment and financial agreement to reserve your spot for classes. Transferability of Credits and Credentials Earned at Our Institution

The transferability of credits you earn at Southern Utah Academy of Healing Arts (SUAHA) is at the complete discretion of an institution to which you may seek to transfer. Acceptance of the certificate you earn in the educational program is also at the complete discretion of the institution to which you may seek to transfer. If the certificates that you earn at this institution are not accepted at the institution to which you may be required to repeat some or all of your coursework at that institution. For this reason you should make certain that your attendance at this institution will meet your educational goals. This may include contacting an institution to which you may seek to transfer after attending Southern Utah Academy of Healing Arts (SUAHA) to determine if your certificate will transfer.

Recognition of Credits Transferred from Other Institutions

Southern Utah Academy of Healing Arts (SUAHA) will recognize credit hours where the curriculum is substantially similar in scope and content to that of the program the student wishes to transfer into. This will be at the discretion of the Faculty and Administration and it must be a unanimous decision. Each student's situation will be evaluated on a person to person basis.


Maranda Tilley, LMT - Instructor (Prenatal, Aromatherapy, Ethics)-

Graduation Requirement

Each student must complete the following in order to graduate with a massage school certificate from our school:

- All 700 hours classroom time or teacher authorized make up class time.
- All 150 clinic hours.
- Paid all tuition and fees.

• Get a C or higher in each class. If the student does not pass a class they have the option of retaking it.

Attendance Policy

Students are expected to arrive on time for class with proper materials. An overall attendance rate of at least 85% is required. Instructors may request your withdrawal from a course or program if absences or tardiness exceed 70%. Students who are unable to continue classes for medical reasons or severe personal problems will be required to take a leave of absence until they are able to return to class. Proper documentation will be required to substantiate a student's withdrawal.

Rules of Conduct

Weapons, Tobacco, Alcohol and Drugs: Southern Utah Academy of Healing Arts (SUAHA) has a zero tolerance policy with regard to weapons, illegal drugs, tobacco, and alcohol of any kind are not allowed at any time on school property. Use of tobacco products, including smokeless tobacco and nicotine vaporizers are prohibited on school grounds. Likewise, alcohol, illegal drugs and/or being under the influence of said substances is strictly prohibited in school grounds. Any violation of school policies may result in permanent dismissal from school.

Dress Code: Students are expected to dress comfortably in flexible clothing. Sweatpants or yoga pants and the school t-shirt are recommended. Sleeveless shirts, tank tops, low scooping V necks, are inappropriate. T-shirts should have at least a ¼ length sleeve and cover the midriff completely. Clean socks, bare feet, or indoor-only shoes are required. Nails should be trimmed short and long hair should be tied back. Students are asked to avoid strongly scented products such as perfumes, colognes, body sprays, deodorants and essential oils. A student arriving to class with inappropriate clothing, poor hygiene or strong scents may be asked to rectify the issue or not attend that class.

Hygiene: Students are expected to arrive to class in as fresh a state of bodily cleanliness as possible. Please be considerate of the fact that others will be touching you and may not want to handle a sweaty, dirty or odiferous body. Fresh breath is also highly appreciated therefore good dental hygiene is encouraged. Students are expected to wash their hands before a massage, after a massage, after using the restroom and after eating. Any items that come into contact with bare skin should be washed after massage work including sheets, pillow cases, towels and oil or lotion bottles. Students who arrive to class with poor hygiene may be asked to leave at the instructors' discretion.

Classroom Conduct: Students shall behave in an appropriate manner for the classroom environment and in regards to the nature of the work at hand.

- Cell phone and smartphone use is prohibited in the classroom. Phone calls and texts should be made during breaks and outside the school.
- Do not interrupt or talk over an instructor or fellow student.
- Please raise your hand and wait to be addressed to ask a question to make a comment. No eating in the classroom.
- Please observe the scheduled breaks; do not leave the classroom mid-lecture or demonstration if at all possible, emergency restroom breaks aside.
- No sleeping during class.



Refund/Cancellation Policy

For applicants who cancel enrollment or students who withdraw from enrollment a fair and equitable settlement will apply. The following policy will apply to all terminations for any reason, by either party, including student decision, course or program cancellation or school closure.

Any monies, except the non-refundable registration fee, due the applicant or students shall be refunded within 90 days of official cancellation or withdrawal. Official cancellation or withdrawal shall occur on the earlier of the dates that:

- 1. An applicant is not accepted by the school. The applicant shall be entitled to a refund of all money paid.
- 2. A student (or legal guardian) cancels his/her enrollment in writing within three business days of signing the enrollment agreement. The three-business-day cooling-off period, commencing with the day an enrollment agreement with the applicant is signed or an initial deposit or payment toward tuition and fees of the institution is made, until midnight of the third business day following such date or from the date that the student first visits the institution, whichever is later, shall be applicable and during this time the contract may be rescinded by the student and all money paid refunded.

3. A student cancels his/her enrollment after three business days of signing the contract but prior to submission by the student of any lesson materials or prior to receipt of course materials, which are some a first, and effective upon departs of a unitted statement of with drawal for

whichever comes first, and effective upon deposit of a written statement of withdrawal for delivery by mail or other means, and the institution shall be entitled to retain the \$200 registration fee.

- 4. A student notifies the institution of his/her withdrawal in writing.
- 5. A student on an approved leave of absence notifies the school that he/she will not be returning. The date of withdrawal shall be earlier of the date of expiration of the leave of absence or the date the student notifies the institution that the student will not be returning.
- 6. A student is expelled by the school. (Unofficial withdrawals will be determined by the institution by monitoring attendance at least every 30 days.)
- 7. In item 2,3,4 or 5, official cancellations or withdrawals, the cancellation date will be determined by the postmark on the written notification, or the date said notification is delivered to the school administrator or owner in person.

For students who enroll and begin classes but withdraw prior to course completion (after three business days of signing the contract), the following schedule of tuition earned by the school applies. All refunds are based on scheduled hours:

All refunds will be calculated based on the students last date of attendance. Any money, except the registration fee, due a student who withdraws shall be refunded within 90 days of a determination that a student has withdrawn, whether officially or unofficially. In case of disabling illness or injury, death in the student's immediate family or other documented mitigating circumstances, a reasonable and fair refund settlement will be made. If permanently closed or no longer offering instruction after a student has enrolled, the school will provide a pro rata refund of tuition to the student OR provide course completion through a pre-arranged teach out agreement with another institution. If the course is canceled after students have enrolled and instruction has begun, the school shall provide a pro rata refund for all students transferring to another school based on the hours accepted by the receiving school OR provide completion of the course OR participate in a teach out agreement OR provide a full refund of all money paid.

Students who withdraw or terminate prior to course completion are charged a cancellation or administrative fee of \$150. This refund policy applies to tuition and fees charged in the enrollment agreement. Other miscellaneous charges the student may have incurred at the institution (EG: extra kit materials, books, products, unreturned school property, etc.) will be calculated separately at the time of the withdrawal. All fees are identified in the catalog and in this enrollment agreement.

REGISTERED UNDER THE UTAH POSTSECONDARY PROPRIETARY SCHOOL ACT (Title 13, Chapter 34, Utah Code). Registration under the Utah Postsecondary Proprietary School Act does not mean that the State of Utah supervises, recommends, nor accredits the institution. It is the student's responsibility to determine whether credits, degrees or certificates from the institution will transfer to other to other institutions or meet employer's training requirements. This may be done by calling the prospective school or employer.
